




Author Events Seven stories The National Centre for Children's Books




Grandad's



Lupita Nyong'o creates a whimsical and heartwarming story to inspire children to see their own unique beauty.







This book has some amazing, vibrant illustrations and is a very funny read to be shared together!

A brilliant book for curious children to share with loved ones at home to learn more about the world around them.






This is an amazing chapter book series for children who love adventure and humour!

Omar is an imaginative young boy and this series featuring him and his adventures will have you laughing real belly laughs!



But just who or what is behind the mysterious infestation? Harley decides it's up to her to save the day – with chaotic results!































This is the first in a brilliant series by Kieran Larwood.

Podkin is the son of a warrior chieftan. He knows that one day it will be up to him to lead his warren and guard it in times of danger. But for now, he's quite happy to laze around annoying his older sister Paz, and playing with his baby brother Pook. Then Podkin's home is brutally attacked, and the young rabbits are forced to flee. The terrifying Gorm are on the rampage, and no one and nowhere is safe. With danger all around them, Podkin must protect his family, uncover his destiny, and attempt to defeat the most horrifying enemy rabbitkind has ever known.

Guy Bass is a fantastic children's author who knows how to tap into the weird and wonderful in a very funny way.

Deep in the maze-like dungeons of Castle Grotteskew, insane Professor Erasmus created Stitch Head, a small, almost-human creature. His experiments continued, filling the castle with creations so fabulously monstrous that Stitch Head was long forgotten. 


Her big brother Quinton has gone missing. No one will talk about it. His mysterious job holds the secret...

It was announced last night (31st March 2022) that this book was the overall winner of the Waterstones Young Reader Book Prize — I was so pleased! It is a stunning read.

But one endless summer night, April meets one. He is starving, lonely and a long way from home. Determined to save him, April begins the most important journey of her life...

This moving story will win the hearts of children the world over and show them that no one is too young or insignificant to make a difference. The Last Bear is a celebration of the love between a child and an animal, a battle cry for our world and an irresistible adventure with a heart as big as a bear's.

A spellbinding adventure, bound-up with traditional folk and fairy tales, *The House with Chicken Legs* transports readers to a world of spells and spirits bound by ancient rules and one girl who longs to break free.

My house has chicken legs. Two or three times a year, without warning, it stands up in the middle of the night and walks away from where we've been living. It might walk a hundred miles or it might walk a thousand, but where it lands is always the same.

This is definitely my favourite children's book I have read so far this year.

Inspired by a true story. It's 1940, and Joseph has been packed off to stay with Mrs F, a gruff woman with no great fondness for children. To Joseph's amazement, she owns the rundown city zoo where Joseph meets Adonis, a huge silverback gorilla. Adonis is ferociously strong and dangerous, but Joseph finds he has an affinity with the lonely beast. But when the bombs begin to fall, it is up to Joseph to guard Adonis's cage should it be damaged by a blast. Will Joseph be ready to pull the trigger if it comes to it?





This book was the winner of the Blue Peter Children's Book Awards in 2020 and is another of my favourites by Vashti Hardy.

A year after the death of her older brother, **Prue Haywood's** family is still shattered by grief. But everything changes when a stranger arrives at the farm.

A new, incredible technology has been discovered in the city of Medlock, where a **secretive guild of inventors** have developed a way to capture spirits of the dead in **animal-like machines**, bringing them back to life.
