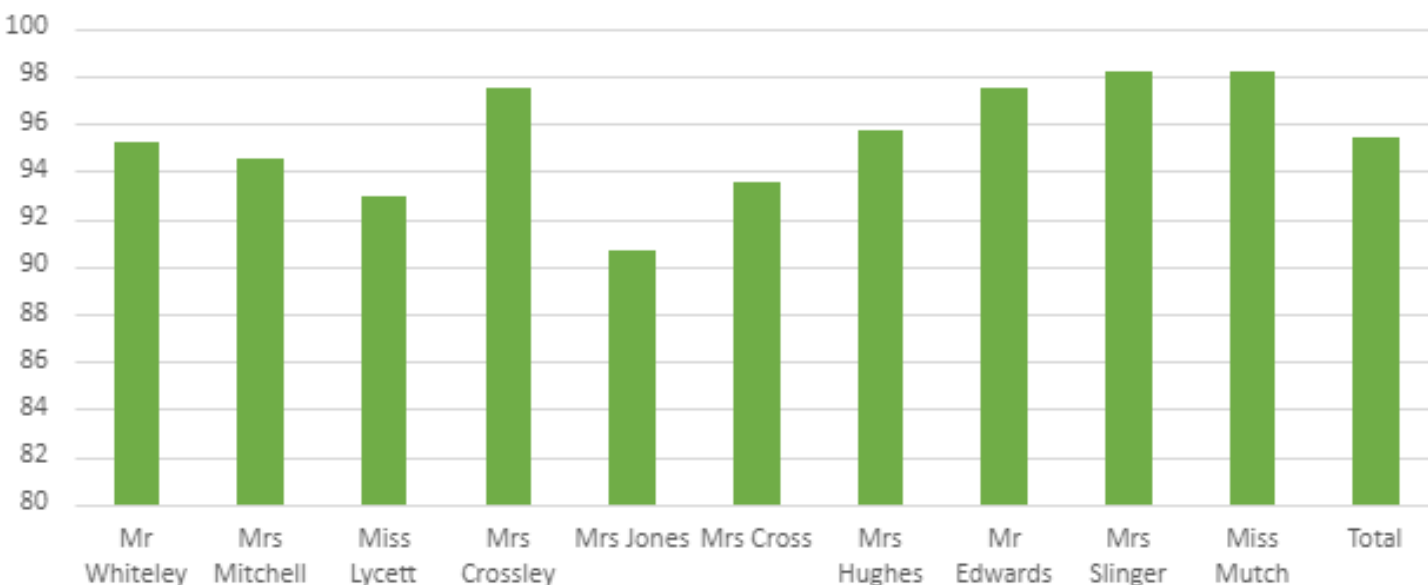

Vyshyvanka Day 2024 is celebrated in Ukraine and abroad on May 16. In a fairly short time, this holiday has evolved from a student event to an international one. For Ukrainians, vyshyvankas (embroidered shirts - ed.) are a symbol of national identity. However, they are now worn all over the world as a sign of support for Ukrainian culture and traditions, which has gained special meaning during Russia's war against Ukraine.

Applegarth School Governing Body Community Co-opted Governor Vacancy

The Applegarth Primary School governing body has a vacancy for a committed governor to help us continue to steer this thriving school as it 'aims high' for its pupils.

Based in Northallerton, Applegarth School has 270 pupils and is a popular and inclusive school rated 'Good' by Ofsted (2023). Having appointed a new Headteacher (to start in September 2024), the school is entering a new and exciting chapter and is now seeking a new governor from within the wider community to join us on this journey.

The governing body is made up of committed and energetic individuals who are passionate about ensuring that every pupil receives the highest quality of education and opportunities to grow and thrive. We work effectively with a highly-skilled school leadership and staff team who have high expectations for pupil learning, development and behaviour. We are seeking an individual who shares our interest in education and promoting the wellbeing of pupils, and who wish to make a positive contribution to the lives of our pupils.

Governors are expected to have inquiring minds, the ability to contribute to debate and planning, as well as the confidence to ask the questions that need to be asked. Governors work with the Headteacher to set a vision for the school and to ensure that stretching yet achievable targets put in place for the school are met.

Governors are supported in their roles through an induction, through provision of a 'buddy' from within the governing body and through other relevant training. Governors are strongly encouraged to get to know the school through visits.

We are particularly interested to hear from individuals who may have experience in HR, safeguarding and finance but we welcome expressions of interest from any individuals who feel they may have relevant skills and expertise to add to our group.

What Parents & Educators Can Learn from the OFCOM MEDIA REPORT 2024

Each year, Ofcom – the UK's regulatory body for communications – produces an overview of children and parents' media experiences over the course of the previous year. At the time of writing, the latest of these reports, 'Children and parents: media use and attitudes 2024' has just been published, and we've plucked out some of its most thought-provoking findings regarding online safety.

ONLINE LIVES

99%

of 8-17s had regular access to the internet

65%

of 13-17s prefer short videos to films and TV

34%

experienced harassment or bullying online

11-18s

felt more confident communicating online (71%) than in person (53%)

87%

of 8-17s felt pressure to be popular on social media

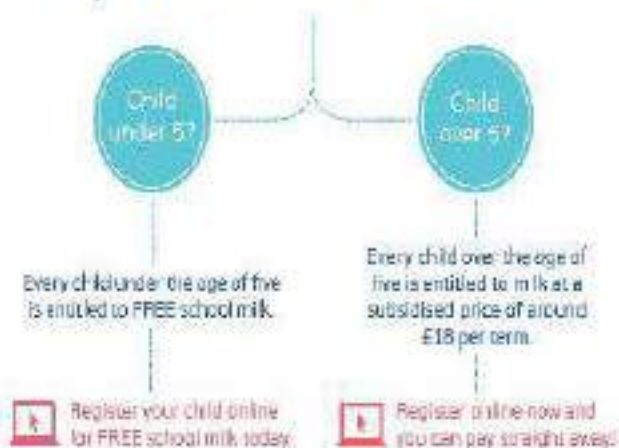
