



ONLINE TROLLING

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

ESCALATION

The term "Trailing" refers to sending hurtful or provocative comments – often done ananymously entine – to provoke a reaction or cause emotional distress. Ananymity can embolden people into saying things they wouldn't dore say in person. Euro 2024 and other tournaments tend to put an emphasis on this, with the abuse of both players and fans after increasing during such events.

HATE SPEECH

Advice for Parents & Educators

USE PARENTAL CONTROLS




