

# Do you know that our school has a Nursery for 3 year old children?


If you know anyone who would like to attend Applegarth Nursery, please scan the QR code which will navigate you to the website page where you can apply for a Nursery place.



#### Absence procedures


- 2.1. Parents will be required to contact the school office via telephone (01609 773521) by 9:00am at the latest on the first day of their child's absence and on every subsequent day thereafter. A message can be left on the absence line (Option 1) or directly with the school office (Option 2).
- 2.2. Reasons for absence are flagged and recorded on SIMs as evidence for attendance monitoring.
- 2.3. A first day absence call (FDAC) will be made to the parent/carer of any pupil who has not reported their child's absence on the first day that they do not attend school by 9:30am.






